





U.S. Marine Veterans retracing their steps on the beach at Betio during 43rd Anniversary visit.





The Japanese occupied

Tarawa just two days after the attack on Pearl Harbor. Following an August 1942 raid by U.S. Marines on Makin to deflect attention from the invasion of Guadalcanal, Japanese Imperial forces fortified the tiny islet of Betio with big guns, bunkers, pillboxes, mines and barbed wire. In November 1943, U.S. Army troops took the island of Makin, while the Marines engaged an entrenched and determined enemy on Betio. The brutal, 76-hour struggle for Tarawa resulted in more than 3,000 Marine casualties and some 5,000 Japanese dead. The hard-fought battle was the first full-scale amphibious assault against a fortified target and taught valuable lessons for the rest of the American island-hopping campaign to defeat Japan.



Valor Tours, Ltd. made the arrangements for a group of 50 Second Marine Division Veterans and their wives to visit Tarawa in November 1988 to dedicate their new memorial (plaque above).



Scott Freund has been studying World War II history since he received his first book in the third grade. World War II research and history has been his lifelong passion. Scott served in the US Army as a Military Police Officer and recently retired after 27 years working for the Sheriff's Department in California. He has been a documentary film producer for over 20 years, with documentaries being featured in film festivals, museum special events, television, and his YouTube channel "SFR Productions". He is currently a member of the All Airborne Battalion, which is a group that parachutes from World War II C-47s at events in the US and during the D-Day Normandy Anniversary events.

Scott was one of seven passengers who attended the 80th Anniversary commemoration on Betio last November.

Terms and Conditions

Reservations and Final Payment

Reservations can only be held with a deposit of \$600 per person accompanied by the Application form. Sending check or Money Order payable to Valor Tours, Ltd., or with your credit card information can make deposits. Final payment is due by August 1, 2026. Reservations deadline is 30 days prior to departure, but based on first come – first served. Space limited. Valor Tours, Ltd. does not recommend that children under the age of 12 participate on this tour. Passport is required, but visas are not. Tour cost based on minimum of 10 participants. Please provide a copy of the photo page of your passport with your application form and deposit. Early booking/payment discount applies, subject to space availability.

Travel documents

Upon receipt of application form and deposit, you will be sent a confirmation, recommended reading list and information on the travel insurance. Check to make sure your passport is valid at least six months beyond date of travel. Visas are not required, nor are inoculations of any kind, but we do recommend getting your Tetanus updated. We require a copy of the picture page of your passport for airlines tickets.

Cancellations and Changes

If Valor Tours, Ltd. receives cancellation by August 1, 2026, your deposit is fully refundable. Cancellations received between August 1 and October 1, 2026 will result in the loss of deposit. Cancellations received after October 1, 2026 or “no shows” are non refundable. Refunds may take up to 30 days to process. Cancellation charges also apply to additional travel arrangements made prior to and after the tour such as domestic airfare. If flight changes are requested after airline tickets are issued, revision fees will apply.

Airline services and seating

Tour cost includes round trip economy class air travel via Fiji Airways, the airline of the Fiji Islands who fly non-stop from Los Angeles to Nadi, Fiji using Airbus A330-200 jet aircraft with 2-4+2 seating. Smaller aircraft is used between Nadi and Tarawa. Business class upgrade is available for approximately \$5664 more per person. Valor Tours, Ltd. reserves the right to substitute airlines should schedules or increased airfares warrant it. Frequent flyer awards cannot be used toward the purchase of the air segment of this tour, but can be earned from this trip. You can sign up for Fiji Airways Tabua Club upon check in and earn awards on partners Qantas and American Airlines. Every attempt will be made to accommodate your seating requests aboard the aircraft. However, Valor Tours, Ltd. cannot guarantee seating assignments made by the airlines or airport staff.

Baggage allowance

We recommend one suitcase and one carry-on bag per person, please. There is no portrage included in this tour and therefore everyone will be responsible for their own luggage. It's for this reason that we recommend travelling light and using suitcases on wheels. Passengers are responsible for carry-on bags, purses, camera bags, briefcases, etc. No responsibility is accepted for loss or damage to baggage, or any of the passenger's belongings. Limited baggage insurance is included in the tour cost.

Travel insurance

Travel emergency medical insurance and trip cancellation coverage with Travelix is made available to all participants. We strongly recommend this coverage.



The hotels on Tarawa are very basic. Depending on the size of our group we will most likely use the Betio Lodge which has an on site restaurant and bar, self service laundry, wireless internet. Can't always count on the shower running hot water but since Tarawa is only 50 miles from the equator, you won't care. Watch for the green flash on the horizon at sunset.

Tour cost \$4600 per person, twin share



Optional stopover in Fiji on the way home:

Fiji Airways now flies between Nadi and Los Angeles daily. Stopovers in Nadi are possible on return leg of tour. We use the Tokatoka Hotel near Nadi Airport or the Intercontinental Hotel on the beach.

Optional extension to Guadalcanal:

Schedules change regularly so you may have to spend a night or two or three at Nadi before the next flight to Guadalcanal. Spend three nights on Guadalcanal and return to Nadi. Cost approx. \$2,500 per person, twin share air/land.
