Thu October 16 – Arrive Krakow, Poland. Met and transferred to hotel. Welcome dinner and introductions. Overnight Sheraton Hotel. (D)

Fri October 17 - After breakfast, tour Krakow's Old Town, Wawel Hill, Kazimierz (Jewish Quarter of Krakow) including entrance to Remuih Synagogue & Cemetery and other Nazi sights. Overnight Sheraton Hotel. (B)

Sat October 18- After breakfast, visit to area of former Plaszow labor Camp; Podgorze and Ghetto Heroes Square; Schindler's Factory Museum. Overnight Sheraton Hotel. (B)

Sun October 19 – After breakfast, drive to Auschwitz-Birkenau Concentration Camp for tour. Overnight Sheraton Hotel. (B)

Mon October 20 – After breakfast check out of hotel and drive to Rogoznica to visit sight of Gross-Rosen Labor Camp. Then onto Wroclaw and overnight HP Park Plaza Hotel, Wroclaw for three nights. (B)

Tue October 21 – After breakfast, head to *Riese Complex. Afternoon visit Ksiaz Castle and underground tunnels. According to period documents these sights served as secret HQs for Hitler and his closest accomlices while the rest of the Riese complex was to become a hidden HQ for the Wehrmacht. Back to Wroclaw. Wed October 22 – After breakfast, early departure for Underground City of Osowka to explore a network of tunnels and rooms, dug for the Nazis by slave workers for purposes still unknown to this day. (B)

Thu October 23 – After breakfast, drive to Zagan to see the remains of Stalag Luft III, depicted in the movie "The Great Escape". Then onto Dresden, heavily bombed during the war. Afternoon cruise on the Elbe River. Overnight Steigenberger de Saxe hotel, Dresden. (B)

Fri October 24 – After breakfast depart Dresden for Bautzen Memorials, sight of a massive military action that took place April 21 to 30, 1945. Then onto Prague in Czech Republic to see the sight where Reinhardt Heidrich was assassinated along with a church that the SS Shot the assassins. Overnight Grandior Hotel, Prague. (B)

Sat October 25 – After breakfast, leave Prague for Braunan Am Inn, the house where Hitler was born; afternoon to Leonding and the house where Hitler lived as a child, school he attended and the cemetery where his family is buried. Then onto Linz by way of Realschulte, Old Cathedral, Landestheater. Overnight Schwarzer Bar Hotel in Linz. (B)

Sun October 26 – After breakfast, visit the Mauthausen Concentration Camp. Then onto the underground mountain facility at Gusen for a tour of the manufacturing center for the ME 262 and research of advance weapons. Gusen Labor Camp. Then back to hotel in Linz. (B)

Mon October 27 - After breakfast, leave Linz for Vienna. Upon arrival historical walking tour of Vienna Hitler sights followed in the afternoon after lunch of coach tour of Vienna. Gestapo Haus Memorial. Farewell dinner. Overnight Hilton Vienna Danube Waterfront. (B, D)

Work on the underground Complex Osowka commenced in the middle of 1943. It resulted in creating a huge system of concrete corridors, fortifications and halls. The purpose of the work was kept in secret. Some say it was meant to be the secret quarters of Hitler.

Eighty kilometres southwest of Wrocław, the Owl Mountains are one of Poland's oldest mountain ranges – a compact massif of steep, largely inaccessible terrain overgrown with spruce forest stretching along the Czech border. It was here in 1943, as the tide of war began to turn against the Third Reich, that Hitler ordered the undertaking of a massive, topsecret underground complex known as Project 'Riese' (Giant). One of the Führer's most ambitious and maniacal schemes, the exact nature of which remains unclear. Riese remains one of World War II's greatest mysteries, about which suspiciously little is known over seventy years since.
