SOUTHERN FRANCE 1944



The Allied invasion of southern France on 15 August 1944 and the US Seventh Army advance northwards to the German border at the Black Forest. Often over-shadowed by the more famous Op OVERLORD in Normandy which took place on 6 June 1944 earlier, Op DRAGOON is the forgotten Allied invasion of Europe. An amphibious assault by US Seventh Army, followed up by the seven French Divisions of what became First French Army, forced the German Army Group G to abandon southern France and retreat towards the Vosges Mountains. We shall visit all the landing beaches from St Raphael to St Tropez and then head north up the Rhone Valley towards Germany. Along the way, we will learn of the "Lost Battalion" and see where Audie Murphy won his Medal of Honor.

Operation Dragoon Tour to France – August 13 to 20, 2024

Tuesday August 13 (D)

Fly to Marseille. Escorted to the Ibis Marseille Centre Gare St Charles for dinner and overnight.

Wednesday August 14 (B, D)

While in Marseille we will visit the Commonwealth war cemetery then move on to VI (US) Corps landing beaches and memorials at St Tropez where the 45th US Infantry Division landed, Cavalaire sur Mer and St Raphael where the 3rd US Infantry Division landed and Frejus where the 36th Infantry Division came ashore. The landings were an overwhelming success. The Allied units in this sector were able to link up with the paratroopers and gliders of the 1st Airborne Task Force very quickly. These early successes allowed US Seventh Army to push northwards way ahead of schedule. Overnight in St. Raphael.

Thursday August 15 (B, D)

Visit to the landing grounds of the 1st Airborne Task Force in the Le Muy area and study the II (FR) Corps impressive assaults on Toulon and Marseille – actions that secured the key ports of entry for future US supplies and manpower. We will tip our hats to the men of Seventh Army buried in the magnificent Rhone American Cemetery in Draguinan and then follow VI (US) Corps drive north into the French hinterland. We will finish the day with a look at the decision to block the German Nineteenth Army's withdrawal up the Rhone Valley at the bottleneck just north of Montelimar. Overnight Rochefort en Valdaine.

Friday August 16 (B, D)

Visit to various sites in the 'Montelimar Battle Square' and study the challenges faced firstly by Task Force Butler and then 36th US Infantry Division and elements of 45th US Infantry Division as VI (US) Corps struggled to block the crucial N7 road and deny its use to the withdrawing German Nineteenth Army. We will visit key points within the Montelimar Battle Square' that influenced the ebb and flow of the conflict between Americans and Germans. Overnight Chassieu.

Saturday August 17 (B, D)

Visit the site of 117 Cavalry Squadron's gallant stand against overwhelming odds at Montrevel en Bress and study the Seventh Army's push north to the Belfort Gap and unification with Patton's Third Army coming from Normandy. We will visit the Epinal American Cemetery in the foothills of the Vosges Mountains and study the decision to drive Seventh Army through them into the Alsatian Plain as Winter approached. Overnight Epinal.

Sunday August 18 (B, D)

Visit Bruyeres to study the early phases of the VI (US) Corps attempt to reach the River Meurthe at Ste Die en Vosges as a prelude to breaking into the Alsatian Plain. The day will include a visit to the site of the Lost Battalion and an explanation of what the men of 141st Infantry Regiment, 143rd Infantry Regiment and 442nd Infantry Regiment had to endure in order to release the 211 survivors of 1st Battalion 141st Infantry Regiment on the Col des Huttes. We will also study the XV (US) Corps plan to break into the Alsatian Plan and visit an SS run Concentration Camp at Natzweiler-Struthof. Overnight Colmar.

Monday August 19 (B, D)

Visit sites associated with the 6th Army Group decision to eliminate the Colmar Pocket on the Alsatian Plain squashed between the Vosges Mountains on the left and the Black Forest on the right and hemmed in by the First French Army in the south and the US Seventh Army in the north. The day will include a visit to the spot where Audie Murphy's gallantry led him to be awarded the Congressional Medal of Honour. We will end the tour with a visit to the MM Park Museum in Strasbourg which is rammed with Second World War equipment and stores. Overnight BW Plus Monopole Metropoli, Strasbourg.

Tuesday August 20 (B)

Transfer to airport and fly home from Strasbourg, or train to Paris.
