He was wounded the third time in April 1968 at Khe Sanh and Hill 861 and would complete his WESTPAC tour in Okinawa. He restored from the Marine Corps Reserve in June 2000 at the rank of SgtMaj. He has returned to Vietnam three times since the war.

General Information & Terms/Conditions

Reservations & Cancellations

A reservation can only be held with a deposit of \$600 per person and on a first come-first served basis. Tour is limited to a maximum of 25 passengers. Please fill out, sign and return the application form with your check or credit card information, and a photocopy of the picture page of your passport. Final payment is due December 1, 2025. Cancellations received in writing by December 1, 2025 are fully refundable. Cancellations received between Dec. 2 and Jan. 2, 2026 subject to loss of deposit. Cancellations received in writing after Jan. 2, 2026 or no shows are non-refundable. Cancellation insurance is not included in tour cost, but is available upon request for additional cost. Health

Vaccines are not required at this time, but consult with your physician about Hepatitis A or B shots, which are now recommended but not required for all travel. Also check to see if your Tetanus is up to date. You should get one regardless of travel. As with all third world tropical climates, malaria-carrying mosquitoes exist. Use common sense precautions such as insect repellent or wearing long sleeved shirts and long pants in the evening hours when the mosquitoes are most prevalent. We do not recommend taking oral anti-malaria medication as it can make you quite sick. Avoid tap water in all its forms, i.e. beverages with ice, brushing your teeth, etc. Bottled water is available for purchase. We suggest keeping a bottle in your backpack at all times. Good restaurants, bars and cafes use purified or boiled waters, while local establishments often used tap water.

Then onto the Rockpile, a former U.S. Marine observation post offering panoramic views. Visit Dakrong Bridge, a key crossing point on the Ho Chi Minh Trail. Lunch at a local restaurant near Khe Sanh. Explore Khe Sanh Combat Base where one of the war's most intense battles took place. Stop at Ta Con Airport, part of the Khe Sanh Combat Base; visit Lang Vei Special Forces Camp, where North Vietnamese tanks were used in battle; drive to Dong Ha and check into our hotel.
