



GENERAL INFORMATION, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

RESERVATIONS AND PAYMENTS

Please complete the application form and return with a deposit of \$600 per person. Reservations cannot be held without a deposit. Personal check and all credit cards are accepted for payment. Make checks payable to Valor Tours, Ltd. and mail to 10 Liberty Ship Way, Sausalito, and CA 94965. Final payment is due February 10, 2026. All passengers on deposit will receive written confirmation, Traveler's insurance pamphlet and a reading list. Final travel documents will be sent Priority Mail to fully paid participants two weeks prior to departure. Unused components of the tour are non-refundable. Cost based upon a minimum of 10 participants traveling together and current rates. Once deposit is received, current rates are guaranteed. Not recommended for children under the age of 12 years.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

All moneys are fully refundable for cancellations received up to February 10, 2026. Cancellations received between Feb. 10 to April 18, 2026 subject to loss of deposit or \$600 per person. Cancellation received after April 10, 2026 or "no shows" are non-refundable. Cancellation insurance coverage is available and strongly recommended. Personal deviations and extensions to tour are subject to the same penalties. Payments made by check will be refunded by check and may take up to 30 days to process. Payments made by credit card must be credited back to the credit card used and may take up to 60 days to appear on your statement.

HEALTH & TRAVEL DOCUMENTATION

A valid passport is required to travel to Europe. Visas and inoculations are not required, however we recommend getting Tetanus updated. Please check your passport to make sure it is valid at least six months beyond date of tour. Recommended reading list, description of travel cancellation insurance coverage and detailed itinerary sent to passengers on deposit only. Travel documents including ID badge, baggage tags, final instructions and maps will be sent to all fully paid passengers about two weeks prior to tour commencement. WHAT TO BRING

Casual and comfortable travel clothes, comfortable walking shoes, brimmed hat, suntan lotion, wash cloth, bottle of Woolite, plenty of film, camera (water proof if possible), wind breaker, back pack, flask to carry water, binoculars. Leave expensive jewelry and high-heeled shoes at home. Carry medications, airline tickets, passport, cash and traveler's checks on your person - do not pack in suitcase, as there are occasional delays. Travel light - one suitcase and one carry-on bag per person, please.

Itinerary - subject to change

Sunday May 10 (D)

Independent arrivals into Paris. Hotel shuttle to Golden Tulip Hotel, CDG. Meet and greet group dinner tonight (buffet) and briefing in hotel restaurant.

Monday May 11 (B)

9:00am depart hotel for WWI Museum at Meaux, about 45 minute drive. Then onto Meaux Museum, a French National WWI Museum, with lunch at the museum. Continue to Belleau Wood & Aisne-Mame Cemetery. Then onto Chateau Thierry and the ABMC monument and museum. Ending the day at Chateau Hattonchattel for dinner and overnight.

Tuesday May 12 (B, L)

9:00am depart hotel for Montsec, then onto Apremont La Foret where the 102nd Regt. Apremont la Foret- Where the 102nd Regiment (26th Division first fought) and The Tranchee des Bavaoais. Seichprey and the 102nd Regiment Memorial and Church; box lunch enroute to "War of Mines" Battlefield and American Monument to Remenauville, the destroyed village where Erich Marie-Remarque (All Quiet on the Western Front) fought and wrote about. Musee de la Bayonettes-Much More than a Bayonet Museum! Trenches of Saint Baussant (where Rin-Tin-Tin was found) following the path of America's first tank battle past Essey et Maiserais then to Pannes (where Colonel Patton first ran out of gas). Overnight Chateau Hattonchattel.

Wednesday May 13 (B)

Leave for Fort Douamont, The Ossuary of Verdun. Lunch at Peligrin restaurant; Memorial de Verdun, Chapel du Douaumont-fort Souville; Underground Citadelle, to the top of the Monumet de la Victoire. Dinner in Verdun on own but suggest Chez Mamie. Return to Hattonchattel.

Thursday May 14 (B)

Leave from Hotel 9AM to Meuse Argonne Cemetery
Visit Cemetery; museum. Lunch and visit at 14-18 Museum. Drive to Mont Faucon ABMC Monument.
Drive to Varennes Pennsylvania Monument, Vauquois Hill; La Tranchee du Chattoncourt; Le Mort-Homme monument. Drive to Verdun and overnight Hattonchattel.

Friday May 15 (B, L)

9:00 Leave hotel for Fort Driant. Tour the only German WWI Fortress under restoration and open to the public-if occupied by the French Army for maneuvers, we will proceed to the Hackenberg Fortress.

Box lunch on coach as we drive to St. Privat-la-Montagne. Visit the War of 1870 Battlefield and museum. Then onto Main de Messiges, Sommepey ABMC Memorial to the 2nd Division. Overnight Holiday Inn, Reims.

Saturday May 16 (B)

Leave Hotel for the Reims Cathedral and Champagne Cellar Tour. After lunch leave for Chemin des Dames and the Cavern des Dragons. Then onto Soissons and the Oise-Aisne Battlefield and Cemetery. Then onto Bellicourt and the ABMC Memorial. St. Quentin Canal/Riqueval Bridge. Leave for Albert and check into hotel.

Sunday May 17 (B)


Depart hotel at 9:00am for Albert Museum (Musee Somme 1916); Visit neo-Byzantine Notre Dame de Brebieres Basilica, (next door); Lourdes of the North with the leaning Angel Statue; Lunch in Albert (on own); then onto Lochnager Crater and Mametz 38th Div (Red Dragon) Memorial. Drive to Thierval memorial and Ulster Tower/trenches. Flesquières Cambrai tank Museum.

Monday May 18 (B, D)


Leave hotel at 9:00am to follow the route of the Red Barons' last flight. Lunch nearby or on the bus. Vaux-sur-Somme (von Richthoffen demise site), Cantigny memorial. Drive to Compiegne and Armistice Museum dedicated to the Armistice and the famous clearing where it was signed along with its memorials. Return to the Golden Tulip Hotel at CDG for farewell dinner and overnight.

Tuesday May 19 (B)

Buffet breakfast in hotel before check out. Tour ends.



Due to the absence of handicap and disability laws in Europe, any tour participant with disabilities must be accompanied by a companion who is fully responsible for assisting the disabled tour member at all times throughout the tour. Our tour coach does not have wheelchair lift and staff is not permitted to offer physical assistance.
